TEXTBOOK: *Algebra I, McDougal Littell (Larson, Boswell, Kanold, Stiff)*

COURSE DESCRIPTION AND OBJECTIVES: This course uses the properties of real numbers to establish an organized system of solving equations and inequalities. Other topics covered include functions, systems of equations, solving quadratic equations as well as an extensive application of problem solving skills. OGT calculator required regardless of grade level. A workbook fee is required.

REQUIRED SUPPLIES AND MATERIALS: Please bring the following items to class every day:

3. Paper/Graph paper
4. Pencils
5. Scientific calculator (OGT Calculator for 9th/10th grade)

TESTS: Tests will be given approximately once every two weeks. Students must discuss with me a possible time to make up a missed test. *An unexcused absence on the day of the test will result in a score of 0. Any tests not made up within 1 week will result in a score of 0.*

QUIZZES: Quizzes will generally be announced, but unannounced quizzes will also occur. There will usually be at least 1 quiz per week. *Any quizzes not made up within 1 week will result in a score of 0.*

HOMework: Assignments will be given daily and are due the next school day after being assigned. These assignments are checked for completeness, not correctness. It is the student's responsibility to understand the material. Homework missed due to excused absences can be turned in without penalty within the number of days missed. Please refer to the Student Handbook regarding make up work.

- Although assignment sheets will be provided for each chapter, students should use their planner to remind themselves of assignments, tests, and quizzes.

EXTRA HELP: Students seeking extra help should contact Mr. Ruggles to schedule a time to discuss the material. Preferred times for extra help are directly before or after school.

CLASSROOM EXPECTATIONS AND RULES:

1. Rules and regulations from the Student Code of Conduct will be enforced.
2. Be on time and seated when the bell rings.
3. Bring all materials to class every day unless instructed otherwise.
4. Respect the opinions and property of other students, the teacher, and NOHS.
5. Only one person speaks at a time, and only when recognized by the teacher.
6. Unless directed otherwise, students should not work on other subjects during class.
7. Food or drink (other than water) is not permitted and will be discarded.
8. No sleeping!
9. No purses are allowed on the desktop or on your lap. Purses must be kept on the floor-if you do not want to put your purse on the floor, do not bring it to class.

Violation of the above rules will result in consequences including, but not limited to, the following:

- Removal from class

HALL PASS POLICY: Given at the discretion of the teacher. Student must have their student handbook.

LATE POLICY: A student's late arrival to class is very disruptive to the learning environment for both the offending student and the remainder of the class. A student can expect to receive one warning for tardiness to class, with every subsequent tardy resulting in a detention during which a writing assignment must be completed. Habitual tardiness to class will result in parent contact and potential discipline referrals.
